About this Scholarship

Each year, one \$2,000 scholarship will be offered to a student attending a Nova Scotia university and who is engaged in graduate-level research work in Environmental Studies.

“Environmental Studies” encompasses environmental science, engineering, management and conservation, as well as environment-related programmes in other disciplines. The intent of this scholarship is to support education and research in those areas in which Clean Foundation seeks to effect change: climate change and energy, waste, water, air quality, environmental education, and the interactions of environment and health.

To Qualify, Students Must Provide:

- A completed application form (may be submitted online or in hard copy with the rest of the application materials)
- A curriculum vitae including details of research experience, volunteer work, environmental and community involvement, and any academic awards and/or publications
- A project plan (no more than 2 pages) detailing the research goals and/or objectives, methodologies to be used in achieving goals, and a project timeline with specific tasks to be completed
- Contact information for two references (academic or work-related)

Please Note: Important Considerations

- The student must agree to donate 10 volunteer hours to a Nova Scotia-based non-profit, non-governmental organization that is dedicated to environmental stewardship during the time of the scholarship
- Finalists may be asked to submit academic transcripts and/or written references.
- The scholarship award will be provided as a single cheque during our Annual General Meeting, usually held in June each year
- The same person cannot receive this scholarship in consecutive years
- Preference will be given to candidates who are assessed to be likely to stay and work in Nova Scotia
- Current Clean staff, board members and their immediate families will not be eligible for consideration
- The student will acknowledge receipt of scholarship from Clean Foundation in any publications
